Guest Speaker

The two Year Seven classes were visited by Mr Peter Plowman last week. He is a maritime historian. He came to St Joseph’s College and spoke to us about Albany’s military experiences and history. Mr Plowman’s presentation was very interesting and we learnt many new things. Peter briefly told us about his childhood and explained that he grew up in an English Boarding School. His stories about what life was like there made us all appreciate how lucky we are today!

Mr Plowman told us about the Queen Elizabeth and the Queen Mary. These ships could carry around fifteen thousand troops each. Peter also told us about King George Sound and all the ships that travelled away from there. Those conditions were terrible!

Surprisingly, more men than horses died on the troop ships. The men on board these ships thought it would be hard to keep the horses alive because they had to keep the food and water fresh.

Instead of going to the Western Front it was agreed to send the troops from Australia and New Zealand to train in Egypt then go onto France. However it was decided that the troops should attack the coast off Turkey but as they came closer to the land they realised they were in the wrong spot. They had to climb high cliffs and most of them were shot. When the battle of Gallipoli began the Australian and New Zealand troops (ANZACs) fought together.

The battle of Gallipoli, however, was a disaster. Everyone landed in the wrong places! The English war Generals weren't too organised either. Most of them never had any training and probably weren't too bright either. Many of the men died and lots of the hospital ships were sunk by the enemy.

Spencer Park Dental Therapy Centre

Spencer Park Dental Therapy Centre is staffed this year by Silvia Jeffery (Dental Officer), Julie Wiseman (Dental Therapist) and Margaret Harris (Dental Nurse).

The Centre provides free general dental care to school children aged between 5 and 16 years (pre-primary to year eleven). Parents of primary aged children who are new to the school will automatically be given

Mental Illness the Facts:

- One in four Australians suffer from a mental illness;
- Most people in our society (85 per cent) live with mental illness - having either experienced a mental illness themselves, or being exposed to one through a family member or friend;
- Around 14% of young people aged 12 to 17 years and around 27% of young people aged 18 to 24 years experience a mental disorder;
- Three quarters of all mental health problems begin before the age of 25.
