### Inter-School Basketball Competition

The Great Southern Basketball Tournament, Western Australia's largest basketball tournament, was held on 22 October, with St Joseph's College fielding a boys and girls team in the combined Year Eight and Nine competition.

The boys team was expertly coached by Will McSweeney, who forged a strong and competitive unit during a rigorous selection process and pre-season regime. The first game was close throughout, with the sleepy Joel Bellinger-Brown emerging from his slumber to nail a three pointer in the dying seconds that saw St Joseph's get up by a single point against North Albany Senior High School. Despite a strong effort from skipper Jackson Hines, we were pipped by Albany Senior High School in the second game, before convincingly defeating Denmark in the third, to clinch a spot in the Grand Final against Albany Senior High School. The team galvanised under the finals pressure with Jack Steel and Stewart Davies combining well. Ben Donkin, Jak Srikrum and Andrew Bonavita were stoic in defence, and Jeffery Ledwith, game face on, embarrassed highly credentialed opponents with his sleight of hand and fleet of foot. The boys finished strongly to win the final by 3 points.

Craig Anning brought years of experience and expertise to the coaching table; the girls forming a tight seamless unit that ravaged their opposition en route to a final against Denmark. Karlee Anning led from the front and the back, maintaining the team's strong defensive structure and continually turning aggressive rebounds into fast break scoring opportunities with pinpoint outlet passes. The evenness of the team was obvious from the sidelines, with everyone playing their role. Meg Gibson and Devon Stoner were unstoppable on the boards, while Sian Loveridge, Chelsi Mier and Rowie Lynch were tenacious against the opposing teams during their attempts to bring the ball up the court. Denmark rose to the occasion in the Grand Final, hitting the lead with around five minutes left to play. With the game on the line, the collective determination of our girls came to the forefront. This spirit was embodied by Paige Aggiss, who made some clutch plays at both ends of the court as the clock ticked down, including a bullocking offensive rebound and put back that left St Joseph's in front by a solitary point at the buzzer.

A special mention should be made of Chenoa McLeod and Karlee Guelfi who refereed exceptionally throughout the tournament, as well as Mark Doyle, Rouie Roxas and Ben Charles, our reliable scorers who worked diligently and indefatigably. These students made a huge contribution to the overall success of the tournament and represented the College with distinction. While the victory of both teams is a credit to the players and coaches involved, they should also be congratulated for the exemplary sportsmanship exhibited throughout the day. All students distinguished themselves, both as students of St Joseph's College and fine members of the broader Albany community.
