From the Principal

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Parishioners,

Relationships continue to be a number one priority at St Joseph's College as they are the 'ground' from which all other activities grow and unfold. Our commitment to positive relationships between students, parents and staff will ensure that together, we continue to do great things at St Joseph's College.

St Joseph's College seeks to provide a variety of experiences to enhance the development of the whole child. In a school such as ours, with fifteen different age groups, the list of interests is never ending. This week there were new additions to our College community – eight pullets (chooks under twelve months old). The chooks have brought excitement for students in the Junior School. Initially the noise and number of students peering at them overwhelmed the chooks, however, as the week has progressed they have adjusted well and to the delight of the students are beginning to eat from their hands. The chooks are about a month off laying but once the eggs appear they will be given to the Canteen and the Home Economics Department. Any surplus eggs, the students plan to sell to staff and parents. If there are any egg cartons at home, please send them to the College Office. The establishment of our chook pen compliments the large vegetable garden being cultivated by the Year Five students. Compost is also being developed. St Joseph's College now has the beginnings of a Sustainability Education Program which will grow over the coming years.

Principal's Report

The Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia has endorsed a process of performance review for Principals. I am one of several Principals in Catholic schools to be reviewed this year. This Principal Review Process relates only to the Principal's Duties and Responsibilities (as enunciated in the Principal's Contract of Employment) and is not a School Review or Evaluation. The aims of the Principal Review Process are:

- Accountability to the Employer
- Renewal of Contract and
- Professional Development

The process will involve the following members of the school community: Selected Staff; the School Board; the Parents & Friends Executive; and the Parish Priest. This review will be conducted by means of written evaluation, followed by interviews with a review panel which will take place during Term Three.

I can now confirm that all students from Kindergarten to Year Ten will conclude the year on Friday 7 December 2018.

On the completion of each interview I inform the family whether they have been successful in securing a place or whether they will be placed on a waiting list. For this reason, it is very important that all current families have lodged enrolment forms for younger brothers and sisters. Well done to the students and staff for handling the compulsory NAPLAN testing so well this week.

Dear Members of our College community

St Vincent de Paul Annual Winter Appeal 2018

In life we are confronted by a multiplicity of choices. We make them every day, every minute. Our choices not only affect ourselves but may also impact significantly upon others often without us being aware of the result. A very deliberate choice made over one and half centuries ago by Blessed Frederic Ozanam was the founding of the St Vincent de Paul Society. It was an unselfish choice made for the good of others and its benefits and blessings continue to the present day. Here at St Joseph's College, we of Ozanam House are proud to maintain our identification with the name of Blessed Frederic Ozanam and the work of St Vincent de Paul. This year the slogan for the Society's Annual Winter Appeal is 'Give People Another Choice this Winter!' and we appeal to you to assist us in that endeavour.

Should you decide to help, you will contribute to a very worthy and compassionate effort. For the disadvantaged, it is dreadful to decide between two oppressive alternatives. Some must confront a choice between putting food on the table or paying the power bill or the rent. Others even worse off must choose in which equally vile and squalid location they will shiver away the night until the next miserable 'choice' presents itself in the grimness of the dawn. St Vincent de Paul report that 'over 116,000 ... are experiencing or at risk of homelessness on any given night in Australia' with all the fear and desolation of spirit that this entails. Albany and its surrounding districts have a share in that unpleasant statistic and its associated social consequences and so, in the matter of giving the unfortunate another and better choice, we ask you to choose from the following list:

- **FOOD ITEMS** including canned food (RING-PULL CANS ONLY) containing mini-meals like steak and onions or chunky beef stew; tinned tuna or sardines; tinned fruit, cans of soup; packs of soup, cereal, two-minute noodles; long-life milk, **empty** egg cartons (Food Bank offers large quantities of eggs but has no effective means of packing them for distribution).
- **CLOTHING** (old or new doesn't matter so long as it is clean): warm socks and underwear for children and adults; winter clothing for children, school uniforms.
- **BEDDING:** clean used or new pillows and pillow slips, blankets, warm wraps, sleeping bags
(Please do NOT donate electrical goods, including electric blankets, or perishable items, junk food, lollies or cool drinks.)

Ozanam House will commence its part in the Annual Appeal in Week Four (21 May) through to the end of Term Two (Friday, 29 June). Drop-off spots will be located at the Library, the College Office and outside the Junior School near the information board. Also, on the last day of term there will be a 'Crazy Socks' day in which students may participate for the cost of a can of food. Please make a choice and contribute to the Appeal. You may never see the end result, but you may rest assured that someone in genuine need will receive the benefit and the blessing of your decision to help.

A group for teens in Year 7, 8 & 9

If you are a teen and have a parent or older sibling with mental illness and would like some extra support and a safe place to talk about this, then "Your Space" may be a group for you!

Your Space offers a safe, confidential space for young teens to receive psychological help and support in living with a parent or sibling with mental illness such as depression, anxiety, psychosis, schizophrenia and bipolar disorder. You do not have to be living with your family to attend this group but do need consent to attend from your parent, guardian or carer.

This group is only for teens, not parents or carers. It is limited to 8-10 participants. It is confidential.

The sessions will talk about mental health education and coping strategies, use art and music for creative expression as well as connect with other youth who have similar experiences. A fun afternoon at the Bowling Alley will be included on the last day.

Parent information – Online Student Declaration and Permission

The following students are required to complete the online Student Declaration and Permission:

All Year 12 students

Year 11 students who are studying ATAR Units 3 and 4 and sitting the 2018 ATAR course examinations

Year 10 students who have been given approval to study ATAR Units 3 and 4 and sit the 2018 ATAR course examinations.

Details of this process is listed below.

The deadline for students to complete this process online is **Thursday, 21 June 2018**.

Student Declaration

All students, as listed above, will need to declare that they are aware of the requirements to achieve the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and for sitting the ATAR course examination. These requirements are listed in the Year 12 Information Handbook which is available on the Authority website at <https://www.scsa.wa.edu.au/publications/year-12-information>.

When checking this declaration box online one of the requirements is that your son or daughter has discussed them with you. Please refer to the above link for this information.

Student Permission

All students, as listed above, will be asked to give permission for the following:

(a) ***Release of their name should they win an award***

The School Curriculum and Standards Authority award winners are published in the media and on the Authority's website if permission to do so has been given by the student.

(b) ***Use of school work for creating support materials***

The Authority is seeking permission for the use of school work produced during 2018, e.g. assignments, projects, portfolios, test, school-based exam responses.

(c) ***Use of examination responses (written and practical)***

The Authority is seeking permission for the use of:

ATAR course written and practical examination responses (copyright owned by the student); and
images and sound recordings of the student in photographs, audio recordings and audio visual recordings that are made during the ATAR course practical examinations (copyright owned by the State of Western Australia).

Your son or daughter will be encouraged by the school to discuss each of the above questions with you prior to completing the student permission. The online procedure has been developed so that your son or daughter cannot complete the student permission unless they click on 'Yes' to 'I have discussed my responses to the above questions with my parents/guardians'.

Please note: Students will be required to complete the Student Declaration and Permission when they log in to the portal before they can gain access to other important information such as their examination timetable.
